In particular, it was reported that there had been an increase in dog fouling in the church yard. It was agreed that the PCC be contacted about the problem although it was accepted that the problem lay with certain dog owners themselves. It was reported that dogs were banned completely from Clitheroe cemetery but it was not known if this ban extended to other church yards.

LCC had rejected the petition calling for a reduction in the speed limit to 20 mph in the village. It was agreed this was disappointing but not unexpected given previous failures with road safety measures requested of LCC.
